Frugal innovation is broader than just being frugal. Broader than stripping products of their luxury attributes and supply them at a dramatically low price.

#### DR. ANDRÉ LELIVELD:

Frugal innovations can be placed on the junction of affordability and good enough quality, while still having basic functionality.
